You can easily find employment as a freelancer to create portraits or works of art for interiors if you have a BFA in painting and a strong portfolio of your work. Additionally, you have the option of selling your artwork through corporate commissions, exhibitions, or museum sales. You can work with an art dealer who will provide you with ongoing employment. or go it alone and sell your works. Along with artistic talent, you need business and communication talents.

Earning expectations: Earning in this industry entirely depends on the growth of your work and your capacity to monetize it. You can start out making less than \$80,000 a year, but as you gain expertise, your pay will increase quickly.

### 2. Art dealer

In addition to aesthetic values, this professional path calls for financial acumen and network building. Art dealers are expected to keep up with current trends, comprehend client wants, and purchase similar types of work from painters, sculptors, and other artists that can be easily sold. You can pursue your BFA degree in any subject you choose. The purchase and selling of works of art is the responsibility of art dealers.

Earning expectation: An art trader can easily earn INR 2 lac year on average.

### 3. Exhibition manager

It is a person who oversees shows with artists and potential customers at galleries. They plan out the entire exhibition. With the majority of BFA courses, you can choose this career.

Earning expectation: As a rookie, you might not hold the position of manager, but you might join the team and earn about \$3 lac annually.

### 4. Museum curator

You should possess a specific BFA degree because you will be expected to raise money, organise events, manage public relations, and gather artefacts for museums.

**Earning expectation** –This is a well-paying position; a recent graduate might easily make between \$2 and \$3 million annually and will begin as an assistant.

## 5. Art historians

An art historian gathers information about art and uses it to evaluate other forms of art by researching the development of art throughout history and identifying any newly discovered art from antiquity. Your BFA degree should include history.

**Earning expectation**: This is a well-paying career, and you may expect to make up to \$3.5 million per year as a fresh graduate with more education and experience.

6. Artefacts restoration

You must have your BFA in a certain course in order to work to repair an artefact. You must be able to take care of priceless artefacts and repair damaged ones for these job categories.

Earning Expectation: It costs about INR 3 lac each year for a fresher.

7. Art therapist

It is believed art is a great way of therapy to solve mental problems and attain well being, an art therapist understands their patients and guides them to the kind of art form which will help them express their thoughts easily and relax . You will require certain experience after your BFA degree to work in this field.

Earning expectation: Art therapists make good money starting with anywhere around 5 lac per annum.

8. Graphic designer

They are in high demand since they are needed for the creation of multimedia, the web, logos, prints, etc. With a BFA in graphic design, you can get employment with almost any creative company, as most of them need graphic designers. You can also work independently.

Earning expectation: Even a recent graduate could make up to 5-6 lac annually.

9. Creative director

In creative businesses like ad agencies, they oversee the entire creative staff of designers, content writers, etc. They decide in the end.

Earning Expectationl: Typically, college freshman may find it challenging to land this job. 7-8 lac each year

10. Illustrator

They create graphics for specific projects, work in creative teams or independently, and primarily collaborate with media companies and advertising agencies. You can apply for this if you have a BFA, for example.

Earning expectation: 3-4 lac per annum as fresher

11. UX designer

Their job description involves designing an atmosphere that will improve user experience. They collaborate closely with the user or customer. A UX design BFA qualifies you to apply for this position.

Earning expectation: 2-3 lac per annum as fresher.

It is generally in demand since any product manufacturing requires a designer to make it more functional and aesthetic. With a BFA in product designing you may apply for this

Earning expectation: 5-6 lac per annum

# 13. Interior designer

They are crucial for both commercial and residential structures because they work to make an area look aesthetically attractive. To work as an interior designer, you should possess a BFA in interior design.

**Earning expectation**: The salary for an interior designer ranges from 5 to 6 lac per year, depending on the projects they are given. As a new employee, they may work for a company that pays less.

# 14. Industrial designer

A idea for a certain product or a transaction must be developed by an industrial designer in a way that is advantageous to both the makers and the consumers.

**Earning expectation**: Even though there are less opportunities for careers in this profession, well-known companies hire industrial designers because they offer competitive salaries.

# 15. Technical designer

Technical designers focus on the design's technicality. For instance, in the fashion sector, a technical designer is responsible for bringing a textile designer's design to reality. It is their responsibility to consider the usability of a design.

Earning expectation - A fresher may expect 3-4 annum per year



# The Importance of Fine Arts Education

Education in the arts is an integral part of the development of each human being. Those who have studied learning processes throughout the ages, beginning with Plato, have emphasized the importance of the arts in the education process. Arts education refers to education in the disciplines of music, dance, theatre, and visual arts. Study in the arts is integral to our society. They are a part of the cultural heritage of every American. The arts are what make us most human, most complete as people. The arts cannot be learned through occasional or random exposure any more than math or science can. Education and engagement in the fine arts are an essential part of the school curriculum and an important component in the educational program of every student in Katy ISD.

Sufficient data exists to overwhelmingly support the belief that study and participation in the fine arts is a key component in improving learning throughout all academic areas. Evidence of its effectiveness in reducing student dropouts, raising student attendance, developing better team players, fostering a love for learning, improving greater student dignity, enhancing student creativity, and producing a more prepared citizen for the workplace for tomorrow can be found documented in studies held in many varied settings,

from school campuses, to corporate America.

Evidence from brain research is only one of many reasons education and engagement in the fine arts is beneficial to the educational process. The arts develop neural systems that produce a broad spectrum of benefits ranging from fine motor skills to creativity and improved emotional balance. One must realize that these systems often take months and even years to fine-tune. In a study conducted by Judith Burton, Columbia University, research evidenced that subjects such as mathematics, science, and language require complex cognitive and creative capacities "typical of arts learning" (Burton, Horowitz, & Abeles, 1999). "The arts enhance the process of learning. The systems they nourish, which include our integrated sensory, attentional, cognitive, emotional, and motor capacities, are, in fact, the driving forces behind all other learning" (Jensen, 2001).

The fine arts also provide learners with non-academic benefits such as promoting self-esteem, motivation, aesthetic awareness, cultural exposure, creativity, improved emotional expression, as well as social harmony and appreciation of diversity. These are the very fibers of the fabric known as our

American culture.

The following are findings reported in Champions of Change: The Impact of the Arts on Learning (Fiske, 1999) that should be noted by every parent, teacher, and administrator:

The arts reach students not normally reached, in ways and methods not normally used. (This leads to better student attendance and lower dropout rates.)

• It changes the learning environment to one of discovery. (This often re-ignites the love of learning in students tired of just being fed facts.)

· Students connect with each other better. (This often results in fewer fights,

greater understanding of diversity, and greater peer support.)

The arts provide challenges for students of all levels. (Each student can find his/her own level from basic to gifted.)

Students learn to become sustained, self-directed learners. (The student does not just become an outlet for stored facts from direct instruction, but seeks to

extend instruction to higher levels of proficiency.)

The study of the fine arts positively impacts the learning of students of lower socioeconomic status as much or more than those of a higher socioeconomic status. (Twenty-one percent of students of low socioeconomic status who had studied music scored higher in math versus just eleven percent of those who had not. By the senior year, these figures grew to 33 percent and 16 percent,

respectively, suggesting a cumulative value to music education.)

Is the study of fine arts important? They engage many areas of the brain and also have far-reaching effects on the learner's mind (Jensen, 2001). The arts promote the understanding and sharing of culture. They promote social skills that enhance the awareness and respect of others. The fine arts enhance perceptual and cognitive skills. The Burton study of more than 2000 children found that those in the arts curriculum were far superior in creative thinking, self-concept, problem-solving, self-expression, risk-taking, and cooperation than those who were not (Burton et al., 1999). The arts have the capacity to engage everyone. All levels of American society can and do participate in the fine arts. There are no barriers to race, religion, culture, geography, or socioeconomic

Today's world is witness to the Information Age. The primary sources of information content are no longer teaching lectures or textbooks. Learning is not limited to what you know, but is dependent upon how to find information and how to use that information quickly, creatively, and cooperatively. "We are in the twilight of a society based on data. As information and intelligence become the domain of computers, society will place a new value on the one human ability that can't be automated: emotion (Jensen, 1999, p. 84)." Today's students are inundated with data but are starving for meaningful learning. Workplace demands are for students to understand how to solve problems, what makes arguments plausible, how to build teams and coalitions, and how to incorporate the concept of fairness into everyday decisions. Students need to be thinkers, possess people skills, be problem-solvers, demonstrate creativity, and work as a member of a team. We need to offer more in-depth learning about the things that matter the most: order, integrity, thinking skills, a sense of wonder, truth, flexibility, fairness, dignity, contribution, justice, creativity and cooperation. The arts provide all of these.

Perhaps the most fundamental element to education one should consider is the manner in which we perceive and make sense of the world in which we live. An effective education in the fine arts helps students to see what they look at, hear what they listen to, and feel what they touch. Engagement in the fine arts helps students to stretch their minds beyond the boundaries of the printed text or the rules of what is provable. The arts free the mind from rigid certainty. Imagine the benefits of seeking, finding, and developing multiple solutions to the myriad of problems facing our society today! These processes, taught through the study of the arts, help to develop the tolerance for coping with the ambiguities and uncertainties present in the everyday affairs of human existence. There is a universal need for words, music, dance, and visual art to give expression to the innate urgings of the human spirit. (Eisner, 1987) The premier organizations in the corporate world today recognize that the human intellect "draws from many

wells." Arts education gives access to the deepest of those wells.
